## Reflections from Fr. Greg

27<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

### The Eucharistic Prayer

After the priest invites the people to pray that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Almighty Father, he then prays the Prayer Over the Gifts. Then the high point of the Mass begins which is the Eucharistic Prayer. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal highlights in the Eucharistic Prayer eight elements so we'll walk through them.

1. **Thanksgiving:** expressed primarily in the Preface but certainly found throughout the prayer. The Preface is the prayer that starts:

The Lord be with you; R/ And with your spirit.

Lift up your hearts; R/ we lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God; R/ it is right and just.....

It is truly a Preface, preparing us for that which is about to happen, namely the event and working of our salvation. The priest with the holy people glorifies God the Father for the work of salvation.

2. **Acclamation:** *Holy, Holy, Holy*, the congregation joins in one chorus of exultant praise with all the heavenly hosts, saints, and the Church militant (the church on earth). This hymn can be found in Rev. 4:8.

3. **Epiclesis:** is the way that the Church, in a particular way, invokes the power of the Holy Spirit upon the gifts offered by human hands which is then consecrated, that is, becomes Jesus Christ's Body and Blood, and wherein the unblemished sacrificial Victim is to be consumed in Communion by those who partake in it. The words are often accompanied by the priest holding his hands over the gifts and bells being rung to communicate the Holy Spirit being sent in a particular way.

4. **The institution narrative and Consecration,** by which, by means of the words and actions of Christ, that Sacrifice is effected which Christ himself instituted during the Last Supper, when he offered his Body and Blood under the species of bread and wine, gave them to the Apostles to eat and drink, and leaving with the latter the command to perpetuate this same mystery. Lk. 22:15; Mk. 14:22-26; Jn. 6:51; 1 Cor. 11:23-34

It is important that we imagine our-self at the Last Supper as we begin the Eucharistic Prayer moving towards Calvary with the various elements of Jesus's various torchers with the culmination, namely the fulfillment of the work of our salvation, happening at the institution narrative and Consecration of the bread and wine. We cannot pray the Mass halfheartedly if we truly believe that we are standing at Calvary with Jesus bleeding and looking at us with such love and tenderness. The other four elements will be provided next week.

### ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI (1182-1226)

Son of a wealthy merchant, Francis' aimless adolescence ended when a failed military expedition led to his imprisonment and complete breakdown.

Once home, Francis rediscovered God in the beauty of nature and the ugliness of human suffering, caring for lepers, praying in the little church of San Damiano, whose crucified Jesus he heard calling, "Repair my house, Francis, which is falling into ruins." Francis sold his possessions—and his father's—to fulfill this command. When his father objected, Francis disrobed: "I return the clothes, your name, and all you gave me: God alone is my Father now." Later, the pope would dream of a ragged friar stretching forth a single hand to prop up the crumbling papal Cathedral of Saint John Lateran. Francis indeed helped rebuild the universal Church, founding the Friars Minor (Franciscans), dying at a young forty-four, bearing the stigmata of the Christ whose living icon he remains—in the Church and far beyond it.


