

First Sunday of Advent

Once again we begin the season of Advent, this time of preparation for Christ’s coming into the world on Christmas morning. But this is not the only arrival of Christ for which we can prepare. He comes into our hearts at any time in many ways. He comes to us in the Eucharist. We hope to be welcomed into his arms when we leave this world. Finally, he will come again at the end of time. As we gather in his name today, let us contemplate how we can prepare to receive Christ even when we least expect him.

GREETINGS

This Sunday we begin the Advent Season. This year so many things are uncertain, and we try our best to plan ahead, knowing that some plans may have to change. We remember all the traditions that we hold dear around the holiday season. This year I am hoping to have a light in each window of my house. I really need it this season.

We worry about what we will be able to do, and what events and gatherings we need to forgo this year. Please reflect on the core meaning of the season, the coming of Christ, and give a priority to your prayer and sacramental life for yourself and your children. I hope that many will attend Mass, go to Confession, and pray daily at home during this season. If for your own safety or the safety of others you are unable to come to Church, you can watch a Mass livestreamed or recorded. There are many to choose from. We are sending out a letter with the parish Mass schedules and resources for prayer and reflection during Advent. **HAVE A BLESSED ADVENT**

What Is the Mass?

What is the Mass? There is no simple answer to that question. The Church uses many different images and terms to describe our most important prayer. The Mass is the celebration of the Eucharist, a Greek word that means “thanksgiving.” It is the Lord’s Supper. It is the Breaking of the Bread. It is the memorial of the Lord’s passion, death, and resurrection. It is the Holy Sacrifice, in which the sacrifice of Christ on the cross is perpetuated. It is the holy and divine liturgy, the sacred mysteries. It is the source and summit of our Christian lives, the new covenant, the work of the Holy Spirit, the paschal mystery. The many different words and images that we use when we speak of the Mass are not signs of confusion, but of wonder at what the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (1328) calls the “inexhaustible richness” of the Eucharist. The Mass, our greatest prayer and our deepest mystery, is celebrated every day, many times a day, the world over. Saint Andrew Christmas Novena

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold.

In that hour, vouchsafe, O my God! to hear my prayer and grant my desires, through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His Blessed Mother. Amen.

This prayer is often called the “Christmas Novena” because it is prayed 15 times every day from the Feast of St. Andrew the Apostle (November 30) until Christmas. The novena is not actually addressed to Saint Andrew but to God asking Him to grant our request in honor of the birth of His Son at Christmas. You can say the prayer 15 times together or divide it up as necessary (perhaps five times at each meal).

The Saint Andrew Christmas Novena is a very good way to help focus our attention on the Advent season.

St. Andrew, one of the first of the twelve apostles, brought his brother to join him in following Jesus. We can follow St. Andrew’s example by encouraging vocations to the religious life and priesthood.

MARK'S JESUS

Mark's Gospel is the shortest and tersest of all four. The discourses of Jesus tend to be terser as well. Mark's portrayal of Jesus has none of the poetry of the Sermon on the Mount or the Sermon on the Plain as in Matthew or Luke, nor the extensive, reflective "I Am" discourses as in John. Mark's Jesus "cuts to the chase," we would say today. This is reflected quite well in today's passage.

It is no accident that the dialogue of Jesus at this point in the Gospel according to Mark—the concluding words about the end of the world—immediately before his passion, is riddled with exclamation points and an overall sense of urgency.

We would do well to re-tool our own way of living this Advent, for we live in a world urgently in need of hearing the message of Jesus proclaimed. It's time for us to "wake up!" and get out into the world to do it. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

NEW TAX BENEFITS FOR CHARITABLE DONATIONS

If you do not itemize on your tax return - but make a gift, you will be allowed to take a special tax deduction, up to \$300, to reduce your tax liability.

If you do itemize on your tax return - an increase in the deduction limit up to 100% of a donor's annual income for cash gifts (previously the deduction was capped at 60% of annual income).


