The Catechism of the Catholic Church

2427 Human work proceeds directly from persons created in the image of God and called to prolong the work of creation by subduing the earth, both with and for one another.²¹⁰ Hence work is a duty: "If any one will not work, let him not eat."²¹¹ Work honors the Creator's gifts and the talents received from him. It can also be redemptive. By enduring the hardship of work²¹² in union with Jesus, the carpenter of Nazareth and the one crucified on Calvary, man collaborates in a certain fashion with the Son of God in his redemptive work. He shows himself to be a disciple of Christ by carrying the cross, daily, in the work he is called to accomplish.²¹³ Work can be a means of sanctification and a way of animating earthly realities with the Spirit of Christ

Reflections from Fr. Greg
23rd Sunday of Ordinary Time, Year C
Catechesis on the Mass

Introductory Rites consists of the Entrance, the Greeting, the Penitential Act, the *Kyrie*, the *Gloria* and the Collect; these have the character of a beginning, an introduction, and a preparation. Their purpose is to ensure that the faithful, who come together as one, establish communion and dispose themselves properly to listen to the Word of God and to celebrate the Eucharist worthily.

The **entrance procession** with the priest and ministers is accompanied by the Entrance Chant which is most commonly a hymn but chanting of an antiphon and psalm verses is the preferred option. The purpose of the Entrance procession is to open the celebration, foster unity of those who have been gathered (individual voices united in one song of praise), introduce the faithful's thoughts to the mystery and accompany the procession of the Priest and ministers. It's the starting lineup for the only game that truly matters: music, entrance, everyone stands united in purpose, etc.

The **greeting** consists of the sign of the cross and by means of the greeting the priest signifies the presence of the Lord; by this greeting and the people's response, the mystery of the Church gathered together is made manifest.

The **Penitential Act**, the Priest calls upon the whole community to take part in calling to mind one's sins and asking for forgiveness, the priest offers absolution, which, lacks the efficacy of the Sacrament of Penance. It does remit venial sins but not mortal sins. The *Kyrie* (Lord have mercy) is sung or recited. The **Gloria** is a most ancient and venerable hymn by which the Church, gathered in the Holy Spirit, glorifies and entreats God the Father and the Lamb. It is to be sung but if not, it is to be recited. It is sung or said on Sundays outside of Advent and Lent, and also on Solemnities and Feasts, and at particular celebrations of a more solemn character.

The **Collect**: the Priest calls upon the people to pray and everybody, together with the Priest, observe a brief silence so that they may become aware of being in God's presence and may call to mind their intentions. By an ancient tradition of the Church, the Collect prayer is usually addressed to God the Father, through Christ, in the Holy Spirit, and is concluded with a Trinitarian ending. The people make the prayer their own by means of the acclamation *Amen*.

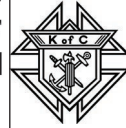

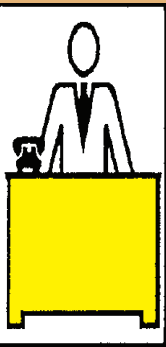
